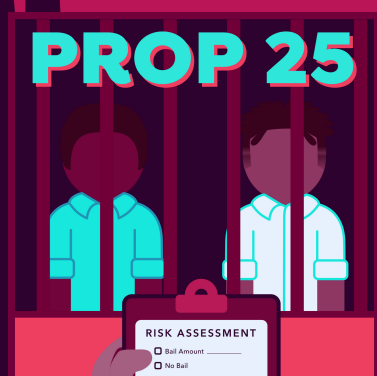


CHECK IT.

PROP 25

Prop 25 is a referendum on SB 10 and eliminates the pre-trial, cash bail system. It requires the automatic release of people accused of most misdemeanor crimes within 12 hours of being placed in jail.

Release for felonies and certain misdemeanors, ie those ineligible for automatic release, would require a risk assessment to determine the accused's risk of committing a new crime or failing to appear in court if released.

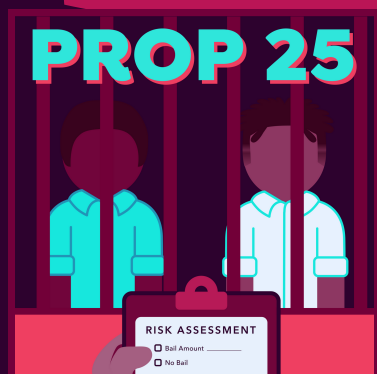


CHECK IT.

PROP 25 cont

High and medium-risk people who are not released would remain in county jail until arraignment. Risk assignments must be completed within 36 hours of being placed in jail

Unlike current law, people can not be charged a dollar fee as a condition of release. State trial courts would be responsible for risk assessment and could use court employees as assessment staff or contract with local public agencies (i.e. county probation depts) to perform risk assessments.

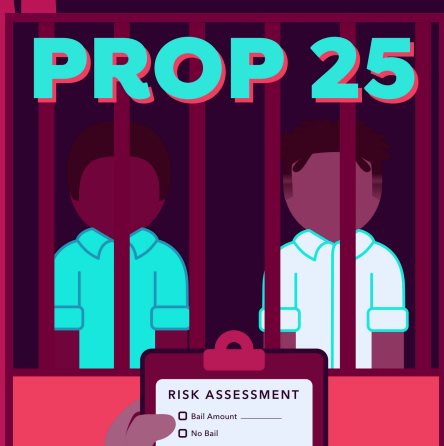


SO IF YOU...

VOTE YES?

A “yes” vote supports Senate Bill 10, passed in 2018, which banished cash bail from the State criminal justice system and replaced it with risk assessments for detained suspects awaiting trial.

No one would pay any money to be released from jail before trial. Instead, people would either be released automatically or based on their risk assessment.

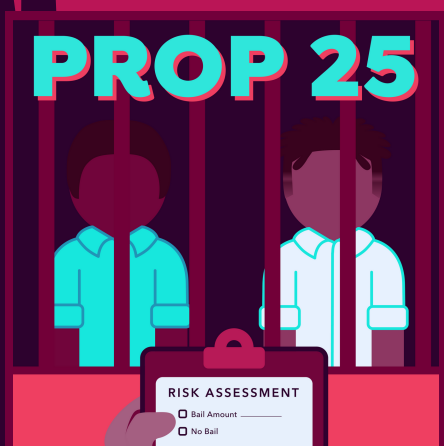


SO IF YOU...

A “no” vote will repeal Senate Bill 10, passed in 2018, keeping the cash bail system in place.

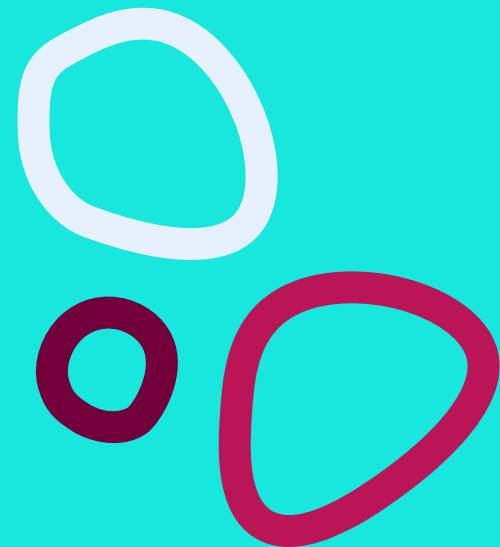
Some people would still to pay bail to be released from jail pre-trial. Other people could continue to be released without paying bail. Some fees may be required as a condition of release.



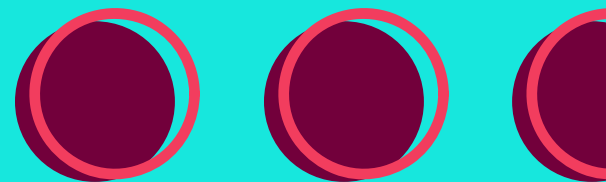
