PROP 16

Prop 16 would allow public offices, colleges and universities to consider race, sex, color, ethnicity or country of origin when making hiring or admission decisions. Prop 16 would repeal prop 209 (passed in 1996), which banned “affirmative action” or the considerations of race, sex, color, ethnicity or country of origin in decision making.

A consequence of Prop 209 was the immediate drop in Black and Latino enrollment at the state's elite public universities.
